



How to Evaluate a Driving School

Inquire with the school to gather essential information:

- What is their teaching approach?
- What techniques are employed both in class and during practical driving lessons?
- Are the classes lecture-based or interactive?
- Do they utilize (outdated) videos as part of their instruction?

When visiting a class:

- Observe whether students are engaged or appear disinterested and drowsy.
- Assess if the classroom promotes interactive learning.
- Take note of whether the classroom is modern and inviting or lacks appeal.

Check if the school provides tools and resources for parents:

- Do they offer parent training?
- Are ongoing assessments and feedback provided on your teen's progress?
- Do they offer tools to assist you in managing the entire process?

Seek input from friends and neighbors:

- Inquire about their teens' level of engagement and whether they learned safe driving skills.
- Determine if their experience involved genuinely learning or just passing to obtain a license.

Inquire about their website and student portal:

- Do they have a website? Do they have a convenient student portal?
- If yes, is it contemporary and provides useful information?
